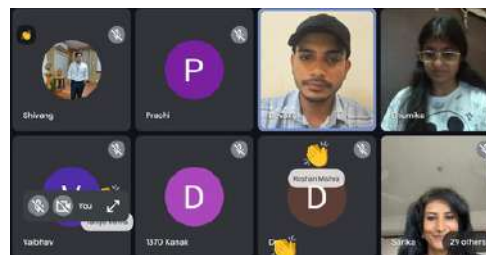
EVENTS REPORT - AOA:

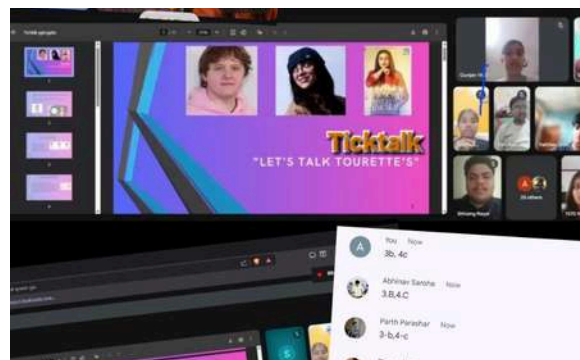
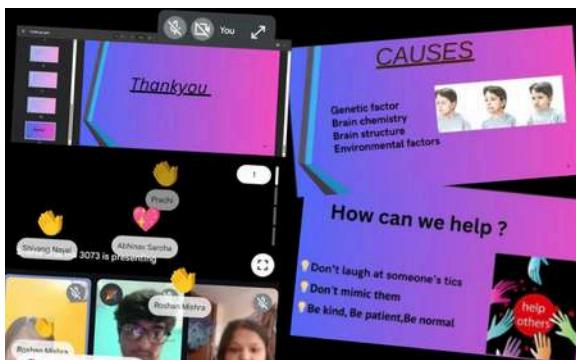
Holding onto yesterday

Neurojourney

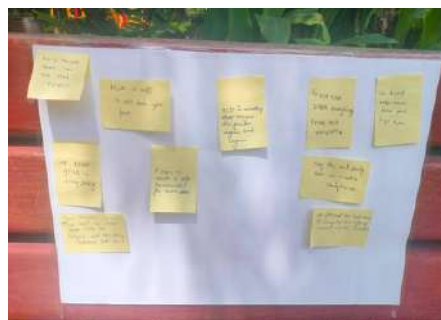

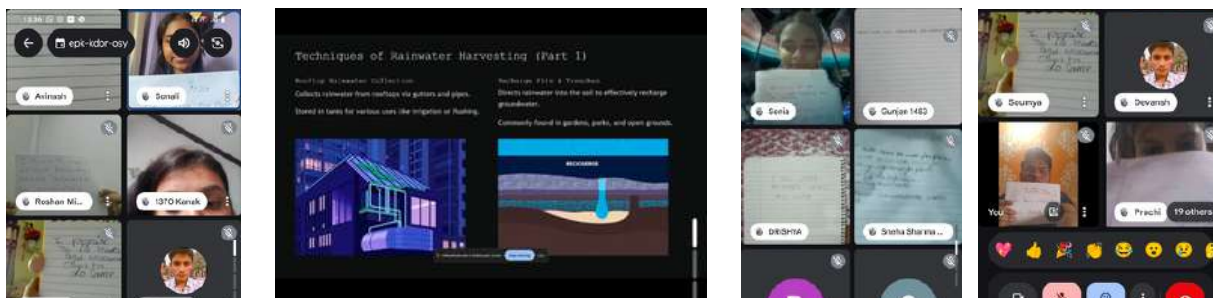
A drop of hope

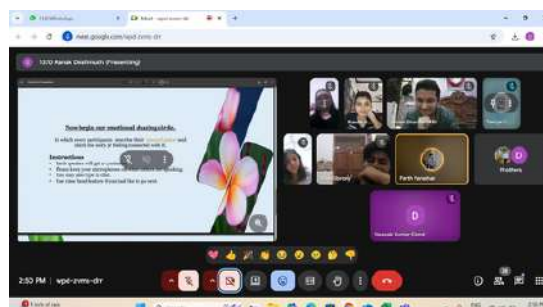

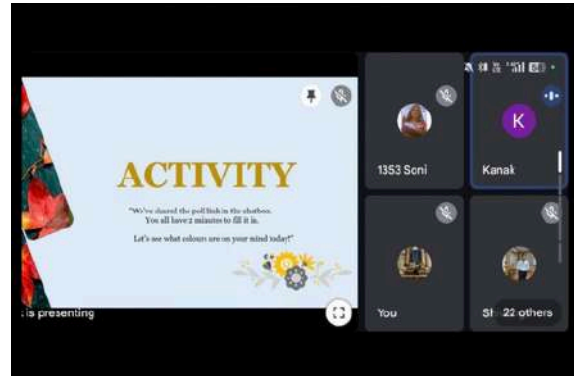

Colours of Mind

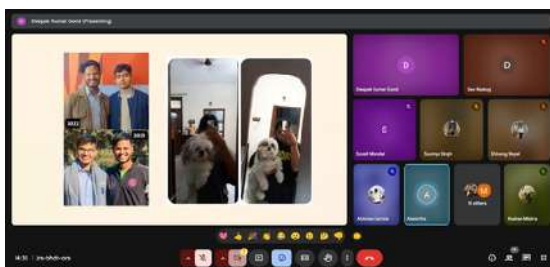

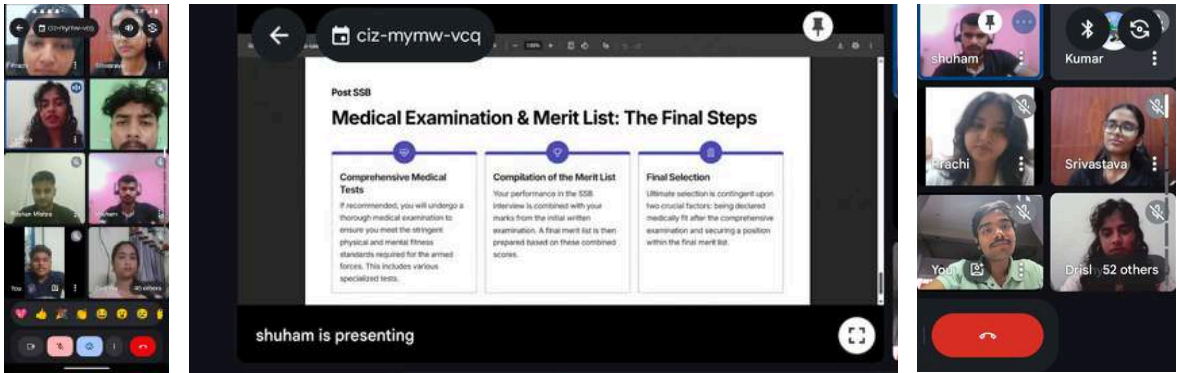
Yoga Day

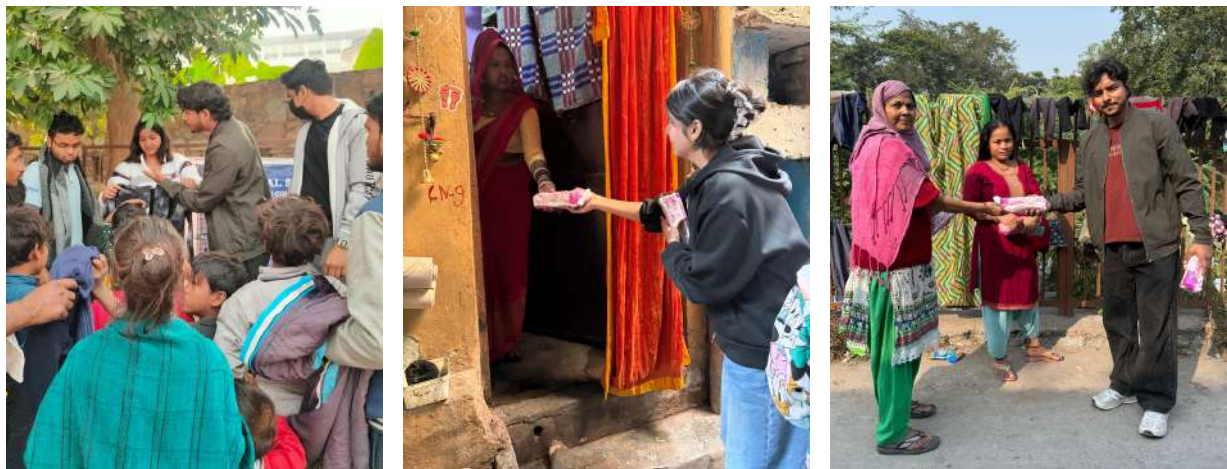
Cloth Donation Drive & Heritage Visit – SAMARPAN (Begumpur) – Day 4
